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SMOKING CESSATION PROGRAM UPDATES

Course of treatment limits for nicotine replacement therapy (NRTs) products

In our last newsletter, we provided the list of nicotine replacement therapy products that will be covered under the program as of **January 1, 2016**.

Below is information on what constitutes a course of treatment under the program for each of those products.

For eligible B.C. residents, PharmaCare covers 100% of the cost of a single continuous course of treatment with NRTs lasting up to 12 consecutive weeks (84 days) each calendar year.

Please note that PharmaCare limits coverage of eligible nicotine patches to a maximum 28-day supply per dispense, and the maximum number of dispenses to three, regardless of the specific NRT being dispensed.

BLOOD GLUCOSE TEST STRIPS (BGTS)—YEAR END REMINDER

As of January 1, patients will be assigned their annual limit of blood glucose test strips. Please ensure you use the correct "Within Annual Limit" PIN, as listed on the <u>PharmaCare website</u>, for claims until such time as patients exceed their annual limit.

Please note: The list of blood glucose test strips eligible for PharmaCare coverage changes on a regular basis. Please consult the <u>online list of eligible test strips</u> on the PharmaCare website before submitting claims.

Note that all strips purchased by a patient, regardless of the payer, count toward the patient's annual BGTS limit.

FAIR PHARMACARE—ANNUAL UPDATE

Fair PharmaCare deductibles for 2016

On **January 1, 2016**, PharmaNet will be updated to reflect annual deductibles and family maximums for 2016 for all individuals and families registered in the plan.

Deductible accumulations will be reset to zero. Fair PharmaCare coverage levels for 2016 are based on family net income for 2014. Universal Child Care Benefits and income from Registered Disability Savings Plans are **not** included when determining assistance levels.

Deductible information for patients for 2016

Fair PharmaCare registrants can access their deductible and family maximum information in the following ways:

Through the <u>PharmaCare website</u>, individuals can:

- use the Fair PharmaCare Calculator to estimate their deductible information, or
- request that a Confirmation of Fair PharmaCare Coverage be mailed to them.

Retroactive reimbursements

PharmaCare reimburses expenses above a family's Fair PharmaCare deductible only if the expenses were incurred after the family registered for the plan—but all eligible costs for the year count toward a family's Fair PharmaCare deductible.

However, if a family qualified for increased assistance during the year, their new, lower deductible and family maximum is applied to any eligible items bought after January 1 of the current year **or** the date of the family's Fair PharmaCare registration¹, whichever is later.

Families do not have to apply for retroactive reimbursement for 2016; it is calculated automatically after year-end. In the spring of 2016, a reimbursement cheque will be mailed to each qualifying individual or family.

BENEFITS

Designated High-Cost Drugs

Certain high-cost drugs are subject to a specific reimbursement limits under the Drug Price Regulation. To assist pharmacies with inventory maintenance, we will provide details of additions to the <u>List of Designated High-Cost Drugs</u> in this newsletter.

Effective January 18, 2016, the following product has been designated as a high-cost drug. PharmaCare will limit reimbursement to the manufacturer list price for the drug plus 5%.

¹ The date of a family's registration is the later of (a) the date the family first registered or (b) the date that a spouse was last added or removed from their Fair PharmaCare record.
