Mail Out

A total of 48 letters were mailed on May 2, 2001 to stakeholders, special interest groups and the general public. One response was received from a Guide Outfitter (Frank Methot). Frank also dropped by the Kamloops Sawmill to discuss wildlife habitat concerns in the upper Deadman on June 12th. No further comments were raised regarding TFL 35.

TFL 35 Management Plan #9 Public Review Summary

Open House/Community Presentations

The Draft MP #9 was available for review at the Kamloops Sawmill from May 7 to June 2nd, 2001. Open houses were held at Aberdeen Mall in Kamloops on May 11 and 12th and in Barriere on May 15th, 2001.

The overall response was very poor. There was no public attendance at the Barriere Open House. The following table summarizes the public comments.

TFL 35 Renewal

Background

The initial Management Plan for TFL 35 was approved and in effect in 1956. Weyerhaeuser assumed management of TFL 35 when it acquired BC Interior Sawmills in 1970. The Management Plan currently under consideration is the ninth in the series since the original document. Over the past 20 years, Weyerhaeuser has, at its own cost, carried out extensive research and implemented enhanced silvicultural practices on TFL 35. The result has been a significant increase in productivity. In addition, we've gained a better understanding of the productive potential of the land bases, as well as the potential impacts on biodiversity, water quality and other ecological factors and resource values.

Process Review

The renewal process involves submitting seven documents in sequence, each of which is reviewed and approved by one or more of the Ministry of Forests and, Ministry of Environment, Lands and Parks, before the subsequent one can be submitted. The documents are:

1. Review Strategy
This outlines the public review and/or government review, timing and procedures to be followed during the renewal process.
2. Statement of Management Objectives, Options and Procedures
This outlines the broad management goals and strategies to be pursued during development of a management strategy for the TFL.
3. Data/information Package
This describes the data and technical assumptions to be used discussing strengths and weaknesses of each.
4. Timber Supply Analysis
This combines all the data together and, using computer models, determines how the various resource measures interact and behave over time under different management scenarios.
5. Twenty-year Plan
This map-based exercise demonstrates where the proposed harvest level could be place on the ground for the next 20 years.
6. Draft Management Plan
This outlines the various objectives and strategies that Weyerhaeuser proposes to use to manage the TFL 35 landbase. .

As of today (May 11), the first four documents mentioned above have been submitted and approved. The 20-year Plan and Draft Management Plan have been submitted and are currently under review. The Proposed Management Plan will be submitted at the end of July.

The Proposed Management Plan

The Proposed Management Plan (PMP) incorporates comments received during the review of the Draft Management Plan. The PMP outlines Weyerhaeuser's management objectives and strategies for achieving those objectives for the timber and non-timber resources within the TFL. It is a strategic five-year plan, and its objectives and strategies will govern forestry operations conducted on the TFL. Management objectives and strategies are developed for:

- ☐ timber
- ☐ biodiversity
- ☐ visual quality
- ☐ soil conservation
- ☐ water
- ☐ recreation
- ☐ cultural and heritage resources
- ☐ range land
- ☐ fish and wildlife habitat

The integration of these resources is guided by the Forest Practices Code and related guidebooks and the Kamloops LRMP.

By Oct. 31, 2001, the Chief Forester will announce the new Annual Allowable Cut determination for TFL 35. A detailed report will accompany his announcement.

Introduction

The Simpcw are a division of the Secwepemc, or Shuswap, who occupy the drainage of the North Thompson River upstream from McLure to the headwaters of the Fraser River to Tete Jeune Cache, over to Jasper and south to the headwaters of the Athabasca River.

The total population of the North Thompson Indian Band is five hundred and sixty four. The Simpcw people live on the North Thompson Indian Reserve at Chu Chua, north of Barriere.

Band members are employed in the forest industry as mill workers, loggers, and technicians. The Band owns and operates a sawmill. The Band manages a woodlot as well as a Forest License.

Simpcw people value their positive relationship with non-Native people in the North Thompson and Robson Valley's. We also recognize that our strength lies in maintaining links to our traditions while securing a place in contemporary society.

The North Thompson Indian Band has worked on forest management services, watershed restoration programs, and GIS mapping. The Bands goal is to bring up our members standard of living, to be in-line with what other Canadians know enjoy. We have chosen to do this by focussing our efforts on Natural Resource opportunities, by providing practical experience and by making use of modern technologies with each project we undertake.

Dear Don Brimacombe

As a result of the recent decision of the Supreme Court of Canada in Delgamuukw v. British Columbia, which clarified the law respecting our Secwepemc (Shuswap) proprietary interests in the lands and resources within our traditional territory (see attached map), the Shuswap Nation Tribal Council must make the following general preliminary observations concerning our title and rights, in the context of the Provincial Consultation Policy Framework and land use referral policy of the former British Columbia government:

- The provincial government's consultation framework, land use referral policy and administrative system is inadequate and contrary to the fundamental laws of Canada, because it is based upon an interpretation of the law which is contrary to the lawful interests of the Shuswap Nation in respect of our aboriginal title and rights.
- The lawful proprietary interests of the Shuswap Nation includes our aboriginal title and rights throughout our traditional territory, which have never been ceded, surrendered, extinguished or converted and could never be extinguished, directly or indirectly by the legislation or policies of the government of British Columbia. Our lawful proprietary interests in our lands and resources are valuable and include an inescapable economic component, which we are entitled to pursue in accordance with and to the full extent of the law.
- The lawful proprietary interests of the Secwepemc People must be accorded the full protection of the law, including our Secwepemc law.
- The consultation policy or the land use referral policy are in no respect sufficient to meet the fiduciary obligations of British Columbia, nor do they conform to the law concerning its lawful obligations respecting the protection of our Secwepemc proprietary interests in the lands within our traditional territory.
- The Interior Alliance, which includes the Shuswap Nation Tribal Council, has requested formally of the Premier and Government of British Columbia, that negotiations begin on a formal bilateral agreement, outside of the BC Treaty process, which would include our constituent Secwepemc communities, in order to recognize and accommodate our Aboriginal title and rights through the preparation of Sustainable Development Plans for our Secwepemc Title Territory. At this time, the New Government has made no commitment to consider these proposals.
- In the absence of a formal agreement between the Interior Alliance and the province of British Columbia, which includes the Shuswap Nation Tribal Council and our constituent Secwepemc communities, SNTC will not comment on the substance of a particular land use referral, except at the request of a constituent community.

- Until such time as the Crown governments fulfill their respective fiduciary obligations and responsibilities by providing the necessary support, our constituent Secwepemc communities do not have, at this time, the financial and human technical resources to conduct a detailed analysis, so as to fully inform ourselves of the appropriateness of each proposed land use decision referred to us. It should be noted that the consultation policies and methodology of the new government of British Columbia are unknown to the Shuswap Nation Tribal Council at this time.
- Any land use decisions, including that contemplated in this referral, made by the provincial government within Secwepemc Title territory are and remain subject to the aboriginal title, jurisdiction, rights and interests of the Shuswap Nation, and British Columbia will be held legally accountable to the Shuswap Nation for these decisions.

We do not wish to unduly prevent development within our traditional territory, but to this date, our title, rights and interests in the land have not been recognized or accommodated by either the Government of British Columbia or the Government of Canada, nor have our lawful interests been given any weight in the decision making process regarding land and resource use or allocation. This has led to our impoverishment and violation of our Human Rights.

Moreover, the Supreme Court of Canada has vindicated our long-standing view of our interests in our traditional lands and resources in their landmark *Delgamuukw* decision, and yet there is continued bad faith evident in the post-*Delgamuukw* actions of British Columbia.

Consequently, due to the continued failure of both British Columbia and Canada to comply with their respective fiduciary obligations to us, respecting our lawful proprietary interests, we have called upon the province of British Columbia to take the following immediate actions on an interim basis:


- Institute a stand-still policy respecting lands and resource uses within Secwepemc territory, including a freeze on the creation of any new interests in the lands and resources; or the renewal of existing interests within Secwepemc territory;
- Maintain and provide to the Secwepemc communities within our traditional territory a strict accounting of the resource uses and revenues derived from those uses, with particular reference to December 11, 1997;
- Enter into discussions outside of the BC Treaty Process, as soon as possible with the Interior Alliance, which includes our Secwepemc communities and their governments, with a view to establishing a bilateral agreement to guide our respective activities and decisions respecting our various lawful rights and interests in the lands and resources within Secwepemc territory, with the necessary degree of substantial consultation and authority to fully comply with the law.

We view these recommended courses of action as reasonable and prudent in the short term, during which time we will continue to pursue our rightful interests, and continue to press for the recognition and accommodation of our Aboriginal title and rights, as such, we do not agree with the development and/or activities of this referral and we cannot guarantee that the development and/or activity which is the subject of this referral will not be negatively impacted or stopped as we exercise our lawful Secwepemc title, jurisdiction, rights, and interests.

We trust that you will understand our position.



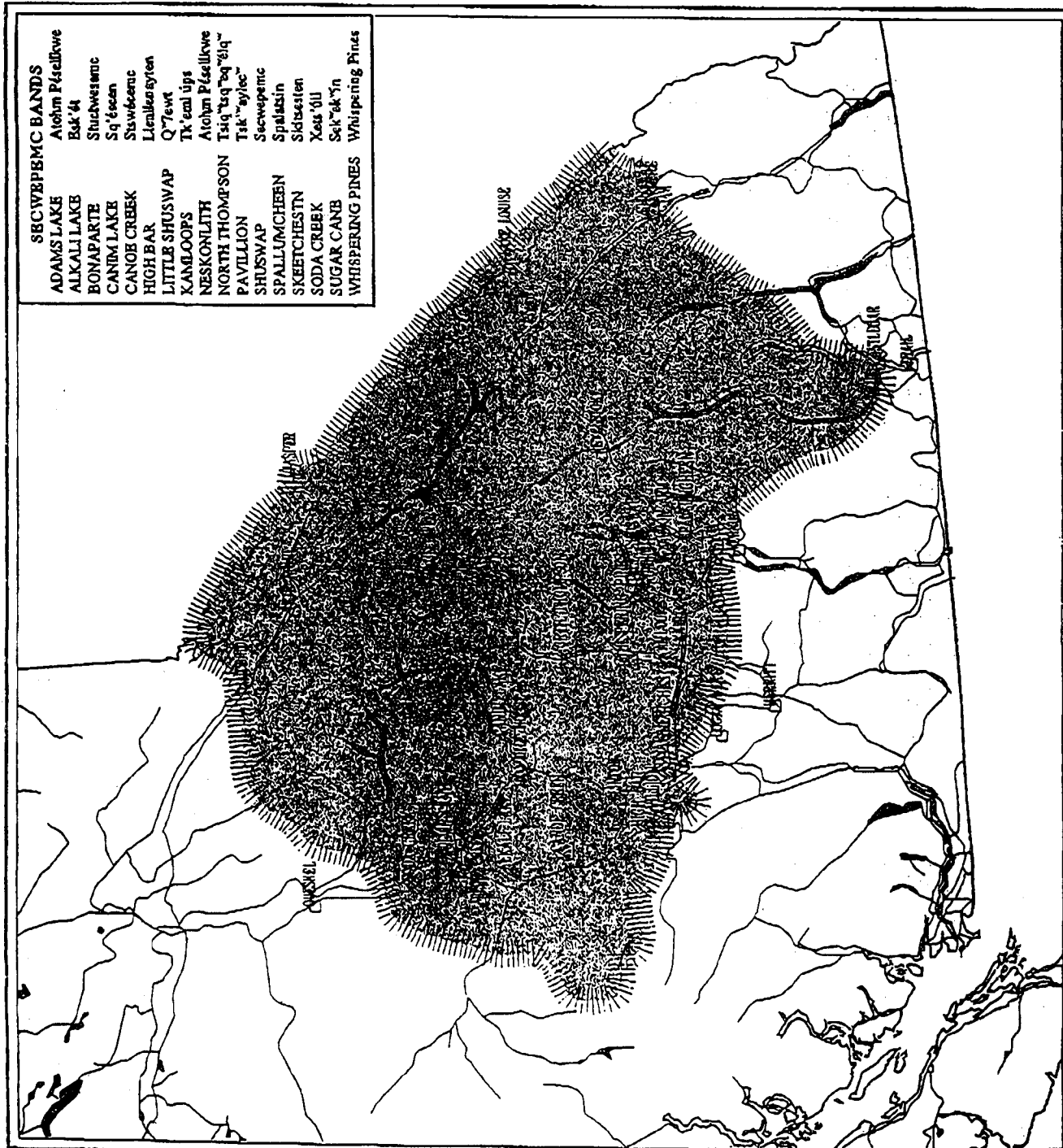

and sometimes warfare with the Sekani and Cree people.

Today most of the five hundred Simpcw people live on the North Thompson Indian Reserve at Chu Chua just north of Barriere. Band members are employed in the forest industry as mill workers and loggers. The band owns a small sawmill. The North Thompson Band administration, governed by the Band council, oversees the social, educational, and economic development of the membership. With other Secwepemc communities, the Simpcw are taking steps to have their aboriginal right to their traditional territory recognized by provincial and federal governments.

Simpcw people value their positive relationships with non-Native people in the North Thompson and Robson Valley's. They also recognize that their key strength lies in maintaining links to their traditional heritage and look forward to securing a place for their children in contemporary society that they can embrace with pride.

The Simpcw

The Simpcw are a division of the Secwepemc, or Shuswap, who occupied the drainage of the North Thompson River upstream from McLure to the headwaters of Fraser River from McBride to Tete Jeune Cache, over to Jasper and south to the headwaters of the Athabasca River. The Simpcw spoke the Secwepemc language, a Salishan language, shared among many of the First Nations in the Fraser And Thompson River drainage. The Simpcw traveled throughout the spring, summer and fall, gathering food and materials which sustain them through the wither. During the winter months they assembled at village site, in the valleys close to rivers, occupying semi-underground houses. Archaeological studies have identified winter home sites and underground food cache sites at a variety of locations including Finn Creek, Vavenby, Birch Island, Chu Chua, Barriere River, Louis Creek, and Tete Jeune.

The Simpcw were noted for their hunting ability. In the summer months much of their time was spent in hunting camps in the mountains above the North Thompson and upper Fraser Rivers. Both river systems provided salmon, which were caught in weirs and nets and by spear. Both meat and fish were smoked or dried then stored for consumption. Numerous plant foods were also collected and preserved for winter use. There was active trading,

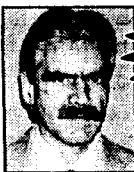
