### **Guidance for Holding Outside Worship and Lifecycle Services**

**Updated: June 15, 2021** 

#### Introduction

This guidance is to support people in holding outside worship lifecycle services including baptisms, wedding ceremonies, medical assistance in dying gatherings, funerals, and Jewish Court Proceedings. This information is aligned with <u>BC's</u>

<u>Restart Plan</u> and is subject to change. **Please continue to monitor** the <u>Provincial Health Officer website</u> as it will be updated periodically, as guidance will continue to evolve over the next weeks and months.

## Holding Outside Worship and Lifecycle Services

Updated: June 15, 2021. All services must have a COVID-19 Safety Plan in place.

	Worship services
Services	Wedding ceremonies
	Funerals
	Daptisms
	Jewish Court Proceedings
	Medical Assistance in Dying (M.A.I.D.) Gathering
Venue	Outside locations OTHER THAN a person's residence or a vacation rental.
Capacity Limit	Up to 50 people and up to 50 additional vehicles (people must remain in their vehicles)
	This capacity limit includes everyone present in the service, including leaders, officiants,
	volunteers, soloists, musicians, etc.
	Up to 4 additional people can be present to help everyone follow the precautions.
Space Between People	• 2.0 metres, unless they are from the same household, or all participants are seated. This may
	be reduced to 1.2 metres (4 feet) if such spacing is needed to accommodate ritual
	congregational prayers, if that is part of a congregation's normal religious practice.
Mask Use	Masks must be worn when not seated.
	Masks can be removed by the leader, reader, soloist, and/or musical group when speaking,
	chanting, singing, or playing as long as these individuals are 3 metres away from the
	congregation or are separated by a physical barrier that blocks droplets.
Before Services	Participants must be pre-registered; contact information must be collected and retained for
	30 days for contact tracing purposes.
	Participants must assess their health before attending and should stay home if sick.
	Clean and disinfect high-use areas, including tables, chairs, and door handles.
	Ensure easy access to handwashing stations or hand sanitizing supplies.
During Services	<ul> <li>Leaders of the service must wear a mask, removing it only for speaking, chanting, or singing,</li> </ul>
	as long as there is 3 metres distance between the leader and the congregation.
	Passing items is not allowed.
Music / Singing	Only leaders, soloists and musicians can sing / play; only one singer at a time – no choirs.
	Congregations are not allowed to sing or chant.
	There is not a limit on the number of musicians permitted to play instruments.
Food / Drink	Single serve containers permitted for worship purposes. These containers can be reused if
	they are properly sanitized in between uses.
After Services	Everyone should leave the venue after the service. Social gatherings can occur elsewhere
	under the <u>Gathering and Events Order.</u>
	Clean and disinfect high-use areas.
Multiple Services in a Day	More than one service can occur in a day as long as participants from each service do not
	interact with one another, and each service must have its own entrances and exits.
	• If multiple services are organized in the same space, allow enough time (e.g., 15 minutes) to
	clean the venue before the next service occurs.
