Sector Snapshot 2020: B.C. Agriculture, Seafood and Food & Beverage Processing

British Columbia's agriculture, seafood and food and beverage industry includes primary production in agriculture, aquaculture and commercial fisheries, and processing of food and beverages.

> Over 200 primary agriculture products and about 100 fish, shellfish and marine plant species are produced in B.C.

- ➢ B.C. agriculture, seafood and processed food & beverage sales were \$16.11 billion in 2020, 3.3% higher than in 2019.
- ➤ Total sales include \$4.03 billion in agriculture, \$0.98 billion in seafood, and \$11.1 billion in food and beverage processing.
- ➤ Growth in sales occurred in the primary agriculture sector (2.1%) and in the food and beverage processing sector (5.5%). Decline in sales was seen in the seafood (aquaculture and commercial fishing) sector (13.4%).
- ➤ Total estimated agriculture, seafood and food & beverage processing GDP at \$5.26 billion increased 1.95% over 2019 and accounted for 2.2% of B.C.'s total GDP* in 2020.

INTERNATIONAL EXPORTS

- ➤ B.C. exported a record \$4.8 billion in agriculture, seafood and processed food and beverage products to 151 different international markets in 2020.
- Total export sales of \$4.8 billion were 3.2% higher than the previous year in 2019.
- B.C.'s top five export markets in 2020: United States. (\$3.6 billion), China (\$398.7 million), Japan (\$186.1 million), South Korea (\$139.5 million) and Hong Kong (\$96.9 million)
- ➤ The fastest growing of the top 10 exports markets were South Korea (38%); Hong Kong (35%); Vietnam (18%); and Australia (9%).
- ➤ Top five export commodities: \$566 million in farmed Atlantic salmon; \$439 million in food preparations for manufacturing and natural health products; \$258 million in baked goods; \$249 million in mushrooms; \$236 million in blueberries.
