#### What is a Mineral Reserve?

A reserve is established by a Regulation of the Chief Gold Commissioner under section 22 of the Mineral Tenure Act and/or section 21 of the Coal Act. It is the temporary legal instrument used to manage the mineral land base.

## Types of Reserves

**No Registration Reserve** (NRR), previously known as No Staking Reserve (NSR), prohibits a free miner from acquiring mineral claims, and/or placer claims on a parcel of land that is deemed incompatible with mining activity. For example, a NRR may be established for reasons such protection under the Park Act, or for transfer to a First Nation during treaty negotiations.

Conditional Registration Reserve (CRR) imposes specific conditions on a free miner who chooses to acquire mineral claims and/or placer claims on a parcel of land. This type of reserve is used to ensure that the acquisition of mineral and/or placer title does not interfere with another land use. For example, a CRR may be established to prevent a person from interfering with, obstructing or endangering the construction, operation, or maintenance of a proposed energy project.

**Coal Land Reserve** (CLR) affects the acquisition, exploration, development, and production of coal title on a parcel of land and is often established in conjunction with an NRR. After the establishment of a CLR, new coal license or lease applications will not be accepted for that parcel. Any pre-existing applications are either declined, or the parcel is removed from the area under application.

### **Search for Reserve by Site Information**

- 1. Go to www.mtonline.gov.bc.ca.
- 2. Click the **Site Search** button.



3. Enter a **Site Number** or other search criteria (provide a minimum of one field), click **Next**.



- 4. Click the **Site Number** link in the search results table to open the **Site Detail** page (left).
- 5. The **Site Detail** page (left) shows details of the reserve, including the restriction type and the BC Regulation Number. Click on the Mineral, Placer or Coal map links to view the reserve on a map.



### **Search for Reserves by Location**

- 1. Go to www.mtonline.gov.bc.ca
- 2. Click either the **Mineral Map** or **Placer Map** button to open a map.



- 3. Navigate to your area of interest.
- 4. Click the **Layers** icon to open the Layers menu (left) to turn map layers on and off.



5. Click the **Legend** icon to open the Legend pane (left) to determine the appearance of reserve sites on the map.



6. Click the **Identify** icon and choose **Reserves** from the drop-down menu.



7. On the map, click on a reserve site number; the **Site Detail** page (top left) will open, providing information about the reserve.
