Update on Activities (2001 – current)

Planning Initiatives

- West Babine Sustainable Resource Management Plan (March 2004) Landscapelevel plan for the Babine watershed that implements the old Babine Local Resource Use Plan. (http://srmwww.gov.bc.ca/ske/srmp/west_babine/)
- The Babine Monitoring Trust (January 2005) The Trust is responsible for monitoring the implementation and success of the Babine plans in both the Kispiox and Bulkley TSAs (www.BabineMonitoring.ca).
- Kispiox-Cranberry TSA Expert Water Panel (2004) Reviewed all watersheds and identified watersheds requiring further assessments; Created guidelines for collecting baseline data for undeveloped watersheds where development is proposed.
- Kispiox Forest and Range Practices Act project (ongoing, see attached summary)
- Gitanyow Pilot Planning Project (ongoing, see attached summary)

Gitsegukla and Gitanyow Pilot Planning Processes

The Ministry of Forests has two in-progress planning initiatives with the Gitxsan and Gitanyow First Nations. These pilot projects are intended to design an ecosystem network, using existing inventory information, that can compliment cultural values and interests and provide integrated management objectives for various values.

Gitanyow Landscape Level Planning Initiative

- Project involves research of existing records, and interviews with chiefs for spatial information about cultural values within each chief's traditional territory.
- Project team to design an ecosystem network map. This includes old growth representation; habitat values and connectivity corridors that can complement identified Gitxsan cultural values and provide integrated management objectives.
- Objectives are being created for: traditional use, water, fish, cedar, wildlife, biodiversity, mushrooms and timber.

Public Comment and Timelines

• The project is not expected to be completed until September 2005. At that time public comment will be invited.

Gitsegukla Watershed Pilot Planning Project

- Project provides an integrated approach to planning within the Gitxsan territory that includes those who live within the territory
- Project will involve research of existing records, and interviews with chiefs for spatial information about cultural values within each chiefs' traditional territory.
- Project team to design an ecosystem network map. This includes old growth representation, habitat values and connectivity corridors that can complement identified Gitxsan cultural values and provide integrated management objectives.
- Project meetings follow the Gitxsan dialogue process of full discussion and consensus decision- making

Public Comment and Timelines

• The project is not expected to be completed until the spring of 2006. At that time a process for public comment will be initiated.

Kispiox Forest and Range Practices Act Process

The LRMP, a comprehensive public planning process that identified the social choices around land and resource management in the Kispiox, was completed prior to the Forest and Range Practices Act (FPRA) legislation. This new results-based legislation will replace the Forest Practices Code. The pre-FRPA LRMP objectives need to be expressed so that they achieve the measurable and verifiable requirements of FRPA, while still meeting the intent of the original objective. This technical exercise will provide areaspecific management objectives for Old Growth Management Areas, moose, deer and mountain goat winter ranges, grizzly bear habitat and Visual Quality Objectives.

Project Area

The project area is the Kispiox Timber Supply Area, excluding the Gitanyow territory, Gitsequecla watershed and the West Babine Sustainable Resource Management Plan area.

Project Scope

The project provides additional detail to the Kispiox LRMP objectives for biodiversity, wildlife, and visual quality because these objectives now have sufficient area-specific inventory data and management knowledge for developing legal objectives.

Project Team

The team working on this project is being led by the Ministry of Sustainable Resource Management, and includes representatives from Ministry of Forests, Ministry of Water, Land and Air Protection and Licencees.

Public Comment

Public comment initially will be sought through the LRMP Monitoring Committee. After this opportunity to review and comment on draft objectives, the general public will be approached through open houses and notices in the newspaper.

Timeline

- Draft plan completed by July
- Monitoring Committee review and comment July-August
- Public review and comment August September
- Open House in September
- Legal Objectives established by October 2005
