

## Geoff Bateson packs Seniors Hall for inspiring talk

tion was the topic of an uplifting, informative talk by a prominent British educator and literacy advocate last week.

Despite a fresh fall of wet snow that blanketed roads on Wednesday evening, about 100 people packed the Nakusp Seniors Hall to hear Bateson, a manager of community development in Birmingham. England, tell "the story of a

The free event, called 'Moving Mountains', was sponsored by Nakusp's Project Bootstrap, the Columbia Basin Alliance for Literacy, and Literacy

"It's the story of people's minds changing and people thinking a bigger picture." Bateson said in the way of an introduction to his talk.

He explained how seven years ago. Birmingham, a city of one million suffering from a decline in the automobile manufacturing sector, was falling further behind due to a growing problem of adult illiteracy.

The city's superintendent of schools knew the schools weren't doing a good job of improving students' literacy and numeracy skills, but the problem was compounded by a lack of communication between schools and community projects, as well as a lack of long term vision.

There was "lots of busyness but nothing changing, said Bateson to several smiles and knowing nods.

To tackle the problem, Bateson said a core group of the community's "key intermediaries" -- the head of the library services and the superintendent of schools, for example - set up a company called CORE Skills Development to implement change throughout the system.

The company, jointly owned by the city's key organizations, formed a small board of about 10 members who meet regularly about three times a year

The idea behind CORE is for the board to come up with "big messages" that are implemented by smaller organizations which match choice with direction.

"Here's where we're going, you colour it in." Bateson described the approach.

For example, a target group of people in need of literacy training included refugees, prisoners, and young people, as well as those unemployed or home

CORE made a goal to educate 7,000 a year by setting literacy targets for each sub-group.

"We've shifted things into outcomes and targets and it's moving it along quite nicely," Bateson said.

An important part of the process was improving the literacy rates of students.

In 1995, only about one ird of students in Birmingham had sufficient language and math ability to it through high school. Now that number has jumped to about 75 per

Primary school children were encouraged to read earlier by setting targets for the number of books provided to nurseries, for example.

Low-cost, small-impact

places begin to add up," Bateson said.

While the literacy improvement project was well received by most involved in the process, it was not without its skeptics.

Bateson said some in the community criticized CORE's "closed board" criticized approach because it excludmembers Birmingham's large Bangladeshi community.

However, Bateson argued a vanguard group was necessary to make the necessary changes and that in other situations, larger boards may be more appropriate.

The success story of Birmingham was brought into local context by Derek Murphy of the Rural Economic Development (RED) Program, which recently completed a survey of rural communities in the United States and Canada that are facing similar challenges to communities in the Columbia Basin

Murphy said that like Birmingham, Nakusp is a community facing economic decline and trying to reestablish a solid economy and sense of community.

The group's survey found that successful community economic development in rural areas is possi



Management Plan (MP) 9 for Tree Farm Licence (TFL) 23 held by your company will expire on December 31, 2003. To initiate the process for the submission and approval of MP 10, herewith is my review and assessment of performance with respect to MP 9, as required by paragraph 2.03 of the licence agreement. In addition, I will provide some guidance to facilitate the public review process for MP 10.



In carrying out this review, I have considered the following documents:

- The Chief Forester's December 17, 1998 approval letter of MP 9;
- The Chief Forester's August 31, 1999 approval of the Allowable Annual Cut (AAC) for TFL 23 subsequent to the approved MP;
- MP 9, the licence holder's commitments in the plan and their performance relative to meeting the commitments; and
- The Chief Forester's rationale for the AAC determination, effective August 31, 1999.

#### **AAC Rationale Issues and Concerns**

As part of the Chief Forester's rationale for setting the AAC, four requests were made of the licence holder for completion prior to the next AAC determination.

1. Refine the ESA classification of difficult-to-regenerate areas on TFL 23 to identify any areas with potential regeneration concerns, paying particular attention to the areas within the 'aerial' operability class.

This issue is a particular concern in the higher elevation blocks. I understand field visits are being considered in co-operation with district staff but that no formal re-assessment of ESA

2. Monitor the timber volumes harvested from the 'aerial' operability class to ensure that the operable profile of stands from these areas is adequately represented in the AAC.

Harvesting in the aerial operability class has not yet met the 56,000 m<sup>3</sup> AAC partition (includes licensee and Small Business). This target is expected to be met over the life of the AAC determination and not on an annual basis. However, the status of your performance to date, expected performance to the end of MP 9, and an assessment of any problems or issues in meeting this target (e.g. location of operability lines, definition of aerial operability class) is to be discussed in the new MP 10.

3. Further refine the modelling and assumptions of adjacency and green-up in time of the next determination.

I expect that the modelling and assumptions for adjacency and green-up will be reviewed in the MP 10 information package, to be used in the Timber Supply Analysis.

4. In co-operation with BCFS staff, update applicable maps and associated records to ensure the respective estimates of the area of Schedule A lands are consistent.

I understand that some initial work has been carried out, but is not yet complete. This issue should be discussed in the new MP 10.

#### MP 9 Commitments and Concerns

As part of MP 9, the licence holder made a number of commitments. Some of these are further discussed below, where they require particular attention in the production of MP 10. Those items not included here are being adequately addressed.

Harvest profile and sequencing: The use of a "relative oldest first" harvesting strategy should be considered in the Timber Supply analysis.

SBFEP operating areas, Shelter Bay block: I understand that although separate operating areas have been discussed with the Columbia District, to-date no agreement has been reached. These areas need to be agreed to before MP 10 can be approved.

Recreation: As the Forest Service will shortly be withdrawing from the recreation activity, your new MP should discuss the future management of the recreational areas presently managed in cooperation with Ministry of Forests.

Operability Lines: Some concern has been expressed by staff regarding the operability lines used. These should be reviewed with staff in the Arrow and Columbia districts before being used in the Timber Supply Analysis.

Silvicultural use of deciduous trees: Although promised in the last 2 management plans, no detailed stand establishment strategies or hardwood management practices have yet been

developed for the use of deciduous trees on the TFL. Consequently, I am not prepared to accept deciduous trees for reforestation purposes. You should note the Chief Forester's letter of August 22, 2000 regarding the use of deciduous in silviculture prescriptions, as well as the revised free growing survey methodology.

Forest health: Please confirm that you intend to follow the Nelson Region Armillaria Guidelines.

Harvesting Soil Disturbance: Some concern has been expressed whether rehabilitated backspar trails suffer from loss of productivity. This issue should be addressed in MP 10.

Visual Landscape Management: The strategies outlined in the Kootenay-Boundary Higher Level Plan Order and how to achieve them should be incorporated into MP 10. Terminology in the new management plan and Arrow RMZ map 9.1 Scenic Areas should be consistent.

Old Growth Management Areas (OGMA): Spatially located OGMAs should be confirmed and agreed to by all the resource agencies for use in the Timber Supply analysis.

Ungulate Winter Range (UWR): Delineation of the new UWR areas in co-operation with the Ministry of Water, Land, and Air Protection (WLAP) should be completed for use in the Timber Supply Analysis.

Stream Inventories: A commitment was made to complete fish stream inventories during the term of MP 9. I would like an assessment of the status of this commitment, particularly the percentage completed to date and projected for the rest of the term of MP 9. MP 10 should also include your plan to complete this commitment if necessary.

Annual Report: The annual report should include progress on all commitments made in the new MP 10, as well as progress on any requirements of the Chief Forester expressed in his approval letter or rationale.
