




K-12 Education and Child Care: Emergency Management Resource Package Spring 2026

INTENDED AUDIENCES: District and school administrators, independent school administrators, and child care operators.









	Infrastructure’s School Enhancement Program or Carbon Neutral Capital Program. The Annual Facility Grant may be used towards elements that support climate change mitigation.
ChildCareBC Maintenance Fund	Funding: Information for licensed child care facilities in emergency circumstances , including wildfires and floods, that may be eligible for assistance through the Ministry of Infrastructure’s ChildCareBC Maintenance Fund.
Child Care Operating Funding	Funding: Can support financial stability during emergencies by continuing to provide child care base funding when a facility is temporarily closed due to an emergency. Additional supports, such as Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative funding and Early Childhood Educator Wage Enhancement funding may also be available. To report an emergency closure and request funding, please email CCOF@gov.bc.ca . Include the facility name, facility ID (Ex: F/G-XXXXX- XXXXX), closure date, (expected) reopen date, reasons for closure, and the type of funding being requested.
Disaster Recovery Information for the Public	Website: Resources for families to support them in recovering after an emergency. Resources include financial supports, health resources, disaster recovery resources, and other information.
Emergency Support Services 	Website: If you have been evacuated, you may get basic supports like accommodation, food, clothing and other temporary supports. Create a profile for Emergency Support Services with the Evacuee Registration and Assistance (ERA) tool.

BC Centre for Disease Control – Preparing for Heat Events	Website: Provides information for the public to understand and identify heat alerts and emergencies, who is at higher risk, how to prepare before extreme heat, and taking care during heat events.






Child Care Resource and Referral Centres	<p>Child Care Resource and Referral (CCRR) Centres: Information, support, resources and referral services to support families, child care providers, and the child care workforce before, during, and after emergency events. Services are available for francophone families, child care providers, and child care workforce through the Fédération des parents francophones de Colombie-Britannique.</p>
