

## **British Columbia Mine Safety Awards**

## **Chief Inspector of Mines' Recognition Award**

## **General Rules**

- 1. At the Chief Inspector's discretion, awards will be given to B.C. mines and/or individuals for outstanding work conducted at B.C. mines and/or for B.C. mine workers.
- 2. Submissions are accepted year-round; however, there is a strict deadline of February 1st for awards to be presented that calendar year. Successful submissions received after February 1st will be presented in the following calendar year.
- 3. Submissions will be reviewed by a panel that will provide recommendations to the Chief Inspector of Mines.
- 4. All decisions reside with the Chief Inspector of Mines, whose decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
- 5. Depending on the number and depth of applications, the panel will review submissions at least once per year.
- 6. Achievement recognitions will be awarded in a variety of categories, including, but not limited to the following: Outstanding Achievement in Health & Safety Innovation; Outstanding Achievement in Health & Safety Culture; Outstanding Act in Health & Safety; Outstanding Achievement by an Individual in Health & Safety; and Outstanding Worker Training Program.
- 7. Submissions should be made by a nomination document no more than 2,500 words, double-spaced. The document will have a cover letter with the name of the nominee(s), mine name (if applicable), and a brief statement of one to five sentences in length that describes the reason for nomination. Nominations may be submitted by anyone.
- 8. There is no minimum or maximum number of awards given out in a single year.
