recommend that the reservation upon all minerals in the lands described in Order-in-Council 147, approved on the 21st day of January, 1949, be cancelled;

(1) of section 16 of the "Placer-Mining Act," chapter 214 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following division be placed upon all minerals in the Gainsco and Green Mining Divisions, namely:-

All and singular those lands and premises of all that area in the Nechako River, Nacho Lake, Intata River, Totschuck Lake, Natsuk Lake, Whitesail Lake, Ootsa River, Ootsa Lake, Sinclair Lake, Murray River, Whitesail Lake, Tahsas River, Tahsas Lake, Murray Lake, Chesletta Lake, connecting and tributary streams and basins, including all connecting and tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn north and south across the Nechako River at the east end of a small lake (longitude 124 degrees and 50 minutes) and below an elevation of 3,000 feet (assuming mean highwater of Natsuk Lake to be at an elevation of 2817 feet) excepting therewith that part of the valley of the stream draining Knapp Lake beyond one mile from Chesletta Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely:- an area six miles wide, being three miles on either side of a straight line drawn southeasterly from the southerly extremity of Pondosy Lake to the junction of Trapper Creek with the Kimsquit River (Trapper Creek enters the Kimsquit from the southeast twelve miles north of and one and a half miles west of the mouth of Kimsquit River); thence four and a half miles to the east of a straight line drawn the west and one mile approximately ten miles to its from the said junction south approximately six miles wide; being from the said junction south fence six miles wide; being intersection of the Kimsquit River a straight line drawn southeast three miles on either side of a straight line drawn southeasterly from the said intersection for eleven miles;

described lands; namely, an area three and a half miles wide lying to the east of a straight line drawn south from the east end of Nenika Lake to the Kinsquit River;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, all that area in the Nenika River, Kidprice Lake and Nenika Lake drainage basins, including all connecting tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn east and west across the Nenika River four miles below the outlet of Kidprice Lake and below an elevation of 3200 feet and upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area eight miles wide (between Nenika Lake and Tuktse Lake) lying to the northeast of a straight line drawn from the west end of a small lake (immediately to the west of the west end of Nenika Lake) to the west end of Tuktse Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area four miles wide being two miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the head of Tuktse Lake to the junction of Moretsky Creek with the Kenano River; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of the centre line of the Kenano River to its mouth; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the said mouth of the Kenano River west for two miles;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area one mile wide along the northerly and eastern shores of Barry Reach, Europa Reach, Ajan Reach, Devastation Channel, Douglas Channel and Kitimat Arm to the head of said Kitimat Arm, including one mile southeasterly from Cornwall Point between Barry Reach and Europa Reach;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area one mile wide lying westerly from the centre line of the Kenano River from the junction of Moretsky Creek upstream for nine miles; thence an area two miles wide, being one mile on either side of a line drawn from the said point to a fork on Kildala River, approximately twelve miles from its mouth; thence two miles wide, being one mile to the south and one mile to the north of the centre line of the Kildala River for five miles; thence one mile wide being one mile north from the centre line of Kildala River and north shore of Kildala Arm; thence two miles wide, being one-half mile to the northeast and one and a half miles to the southwest of a line drawn from the mouth of the Dala River to the mouth of the Kitimat River;

And that the undersigned Minister of Mines do sign an order to that effect.
