Who is eligible to submit?	Only Compulsory Inspectors, certified and recognized by the province, with a Compulsory Inspector credential on their profile will be able to submit an electronic Compulsory Inspection report.

# **Getting Started**

Before you create a CI report, make sure you have:

- 1. An active Fish and Wildlife ID (FWID) with verified user status
- 2. An active Compulsory Inspector credential on your profile
- 3. A Basic BCeID username and Password

Log in to your Fish and Wildlife profile from the Hunting in B.C. homepage at <u>www.gov.bc.ca/hunting</u>

- 1. Electronic Compulsory Inspection reports will be available for online submission for the 2022/2023 licence year onward
- 2. A Compulsory Inspection report can be submitted for a Hunting, Trapping or Species licence, or a nonlicensed kill

- 1. Mandatory fields (\*) must be completed to go to the NEXT step or save this new report
- 2. The Inspection Location is auto populated per the compulsory inspector credential information this field is editable

- 1. If the report is <u>not</u> associated with a licence additional questions and fields are required
- 2. Species licences in a status of Void cannot be reported on
- 3. If the person transporting the animal is different from the hunter additional information is required
- 4. Button functionality (bottom of page)
  - a. CANCEL changes made are not saved
  - b. BACK not displayed on the above screenshots, is displayed on the next pages
    - i. When BACK is clicked, edits are saved and you are navigated back to the previous page
  - c. SAVE AND CONTINUE LATER saves edits and navigates you to your home page, you can continue with this report at a later time
  - d. NEXT saves edits and navigates to next page
    - *i.* SUBMIT Replaces the NEXT button on the final page of the report



# Step 2 – Kill Details



- 1. The Species is auto populated per the species licence
- 2. Coordinates you can enter the latitude and longitude, or click on the OPEN MAP button and click on the location where the kill occurred
  - a. Confirm Location saves the Latitude and Longitude and closes the map

- 1. If the kill is not associated with a species licence in Report Information page you will need to identify the species before moving to the NEXT step
- 2. If the Kill Type is Trapper Kill additional questions and fields are required
- 3. If the hunt was guided, enter the Guide Outfitter Licence Number, and click SEARCH. The associated Guide Territory Certificate Number will be auto populated, or you may need to select one from the dropdown list
- 4. The system will warn you if there is a mismatch between the MU and coordinates (and LEH Hunt area if applicable). Confirm the location of kill with the hunter, and correct if necessary
- 5. Mandatory fields (\*) are required to submit this report without a Conservation Officer review
- 6. If Conservation Officer review is required, you will have the ability to indicate this by checking the appropriate box on the review page of the report
- 7. If any mandatory fields have been left blank, you will receive a warning message, and the report will be sent for Conservation Officer Review upon submission
  - a. Review the information and fill in all mandatory fields, or check the box to show that you have intentionally left mandatory fields blank
