Where members of the public ask Crown Counsel for legal advice, Crown Counsel should advise them to consult a private lawyer or an investigative agency, as appropriate.

It is inappropriate for Crown Counsel to provide an opinion to a member of the public on whether a set of facts described by that person, hypothetical or otherwise, would constitute an offence.

For guidance on the scope of information that could be provided to victims of crime, see *Victims of Crime – Providing Assistance & Information to* (VIC 1).

In carrying out their duties under the *Crown Counsel Act*, Crown Counsel represent the interests of society as a whole, not the interests of any specific individual. Crown Counsel are not employed for the purpose of providing advice or legal services to individual persons, nor are they insured or indemnified to do so. They must refrain from doing so.
