This monthly report provides an overview of BC's forest product exports and markets. British Columbia export values decreased (-24%) year-to-date (YTD) in April 2020 compared with April 2019 (\$3.3 billion vs \$4.4 billion).

- Lumber export Value was down -20%, with volumes dropping at a similar rate (-23%). While lumber exports to the US remained flat, most of the decline is attributed to decreased export value to China and Japan.
- **Pulp and paper export** Pulp value was down -27%, while the value of paper products was also down (-39%).

- Log and other wood exports The value of log exports decreased (-75%), but other wood products remained mostly flat (-4%) due to a lift in other wood product exports to the US and UK.
- Share of Value (Table 4) Overall April YTD US share of export value was up from 43% to 51% between 2019 and 2020, while China's share was down from 30% to 27% and Japan's share was down from 10% to 8%.
- Value by destination United States (-9%), China (-32%), Japan (-37%) and other countries (-39%) were all down in April 2020 YTD.



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### **Export Values by Product and Destination**










Figure 16: Pulp Export Quantity
