CORONER'S INQUEST INTO THE DEATH OF CHRISTOPHER TOM

TOFINO – The inquest into the death of Christopher Tom has been rescheduled. Mr. Tom was detained by police and transported to the Tofino RCMP detachment where later he was discovered unresponsive in cells. He was transported to Tofino General Hospital where, despite medical treatment, he died on Aug. 5, 2007.

The inquest is rescheduled for Feb. 19-21, 2008. Presiding coroner Beth Larcombe and a five-person jury will publicly hear evidence from subpoenaed witnesses in order to determine the facts surrounding the death. The jury will have the opportunity to make recommendations aimed at preventing deaths under similar circumstances in the future.
