

This report provides the latest information on mill openings, closures, disruptions, investments, and other mill events in British Columbia (B.C.). For the latest available list of active mills, please refer to the <u>Major Primary Timber Processing Facilities in British Columbia</u> page.

Mill Investments/Ownership Changes

- On May 31, Canfor entered an agreement to purchase Elliot Sawmilling Co. in Estill, South Carolina, USA for a price of USD \$110 million. The Elliott plant has a production capacity of 210 million board feet (MMBDFT) and it has both large and small log lines.
- On April 1, Brian Fehr became the new owner of the Galloway Lumber, which the Nelson family had operated for 75 years. The new owner will retool the mill into a fabricating shop, sawmill timber mill and a cross laminated timber plant in the next two years, creating 36 job opportunities.
- On May 5, Pinnacle Renewable Energy announced its plan to invest CAD \$30 million to modernize its Williams Lake pellet plant. The facility upgrades will include replacing the baghouses with a modern cycle filter system and adding a low-temperature bed-drying system to minimize emissions.
- On June 24, Hampton Lumber invested CAD \$39 million to purchase Conifex's Fort St. James sawmill and associated forest license, affecting over 140 employees. Hampton Lumber announced its plan to resume operations in the next 12-24 months.

Temporary Mill Curtailments

Weak market, fibre supply constraints and higher log costs continued to challenge B.C. forest industry. Many major sawmills, pulp/paper, plywood/veneer and OSB mills on the coast and in the interior have imposed curtailments/closures. Major companies (e.g., Canfor, Conifex West Fraser, Western Forest Products, Tolko, Interfor, Aspen Planners, and Paper Excellence) have announced a series of curtailments at their B.C. mills. The tables below summarize those mill curtailments/closures based on the publicly available information.

This report defines mill curtailments/closures for the following three categories :

- Temporary curtailments— have a defined end date from information sources;
- Indefinite curtailments— do not have a defined end date and include shift eliminations or partial mill closures; and
- Permanent mill closures permanent mill closures or shutdowns of the entire mill.
