BCTC Annual Report 2021/22

The Chair informed Council that this report was completed and released to the public on January 30, 2023. The report highlights the work of the BCTC between May 2021 and April 2022 and focuses on the BCTC workplan and goals.

Certificate holders and education partners were notified via email in February 2023. Email recipients also received a link to the "Professional Standard 9 – Truth and Reconciliation, Moving Forward Together" video released in September last year.

The BCTC and TRB staff are already working on the BCTC Annual Report 2022/23 which will be released before the end of 2023.

o Appointment of the Commissioner for Teacher Regulation

The Chair's involvement in the appointment process for the new Commissioner for Teacher Regulation will be discussed with Council in private.

9. TEP APPROVAL STANDARDS COMMITTEE (TEPASC)

Shelley Balfour and Joseph Colistro provided an overview of the TEPASC work since the October 2022 meeting and reviewed minor changes to the Terms of Reference.

On May 25, 2022, the Yukon Department of Education's expressed concern that the March 2022 TEP Approval Standards do not include the ability for BC teacher candidates to complete their summative practicum placements in the Yukon (which uses the BC curriculum and employs BC certified teachers).

Based on this concern, the committee proposed further revisions to TEP Approval Standard 4.5. These changes align with the Yukon Education Act and should improve the Yukon Department of Education's ability to attract, recruit, and retain teachers in the region.
