TOPIC: Business Continuity Plan and Disaster Recovery Plan

Business Continuity Plans (BCPs) help to ensure that services, programs, and operations **continue to function** in an acceptable (but possibly alternate) manner, throughout a significant event or disaster. The key objective of BCP is to **reduce the business disruption** of critical functions and services as much as possible.



Disaster Recovery Plans (DRPs) are a component of BCP with the key objective of ensuring the **technical recovery** and **timely resumption** of services, programs, and operations in the event of a significant event or disaster.

Good coordination and liaison between business units, partners, and service providers is critical to restoring business operations during and following an interruption, and plans should leverage reasonable controls to reduce the risk of related actions causing unintended security incidents.

A documented Business Continuity Plan and a documented Disaster Recovery Plan should be in place within an organization, which should outline the process to respond to an event. To be compliant with Defensible Security, both plans must be followed, reviewed, updated, and tested regularly.
