2009 Carbon Neutral Action Report

Executive Summary

School District No. 52 is a district of approximately 2,400 students. Between January 2009 and December 2009 the district educated its students in six elementary schools,

two secondary schools, two aboriginal village schools and one distributed learning storefront school. In September 2009 one village school chose to operate their own school. The district is supported by a maintenance building, an aboriginal education administration building and a board office. Six trustees at large and one rural trustee represent the communities of School District No. 52. Of its 16 sites (15 at year end), 13 are owned (2 of these are currently closed), 2 are band owned (1 at year end) and 1 is leased. The average age of the owned buildings is over 40 years. With funding being



scarce and aging facilities, the District looks to carbon neutral projects that deliver savings directly or indirectly by reducing maintenance on its facilities and vehicles. While there have been efforts made during 2009 to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, the District will look to the future to change culture and to provide leadership to students, staff and the community. The district will explore more ideas and initiatives to reduce greenhouse gases in everyday life in schools, in addition to its continued efforts to address our aging facilities.

Overviews

Actions Taken to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions in 2009

School District No. 52's key actions taken during 2009 toward carbon neutrality were Power Smart lighting retrofits, boiler upgrades, vehicle replacements and consideration of further school closures. School District No. 52's efforts are aimed at retrofitting aging buildings with higher efficiency equipment and consideration of replacement or closure of buildings. For example the District is working diligently to take advantage of fossil fuel reduction projects like lighting retrofits and HVAC system upgrades, including boilers, where there is sharing of project funding, a reasonable payback period or straight savings to the District.

Operational Changes in 2009

2009 was the first full calendar year reflecting the closure of 2 schools effective for the school year commencing in September 2008.

Plans to Continue Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions 2010 – 2012

Upon signing the Climate Action Charter School District No. 52 will continue with past reductions such as PowerSmart Lighting Retrofits, vehicle replacement and boiler replacements. The district made a decision in March 2010 to close an additional elementary school effective for the school year commencing in September 2011. New future projects will include: incentives and raised awareness for students and employees, LEED certification on new buildings (priority being the replacement of a re-designated secondary school with a new middle school, building envelope project through BC Housing on one existing building and measurement practices for analysing success of carbon neutrality efforts (SMARTTool).
