Action	
1.	BC Games Society does everything in its power to reduce green house gas emissions. We continue to support green house gas reduction in our host communities. Part of our host community structure is made up of a Sustainability Committee that will look at specific aspects of the host societies' Green Games plan. We continue to use our electrically powered ceremonial cauldron, which removes over 12 tonnes of GHG each Games.
2.	The BC Games Society continues to reduce the use of paper as much as possible. We continue to do most of our corresponding on line. Our "Guide to the Games" used to be a hard copy booklet that was mailed out to each participant, and it is now an online document. Our newsletters are also all on line.

3. The BC Games participants are transported to the Games in bio-diesel buses .

D. Briefly describe plans your organization has for continuing to reduce your GHG emissions in future years:

We will continue to communicate with our stakeholders electronically as much as possible. Staff will continue to travel to the host communities as little as possible, holding some meetings via conference call and Video Conference. We will continue to recycle our recyclables and will continue to request the use of bio-diesel buses.
