This report provides an overview of British Columbia's forest product exports and markets. In 2022, forest product exports made up 24% of B.C.'s total commodity export value.

Starting with the March report in 2023, Macau is included in the exports to China. The historical export data from 2013 to 2022 has also been updated.







Figure 2: Total Export Value -12-Month Moving Sum 12-Month Moving Sum, \$ billions \$18 \$16 \$14 \$12 \$10 \$8 \$6 \$4 \$2 \$0 2014 2015 2016 2017 2018 2019 2020 2021 2022 2023 United States China\* **-** Japan ····· Other **Total**






