## RE: PPPABC V BRITISH COLUMBIA CHICKEN MARKETING BOARD

On June 24, 2021, The British Columbia Farm Industry Review Board (BCFIRB) received a notice of appeal from the Primary Poultry Processors Association of British Columbia (PPPABC) regarding the June 3, 2021 decision of the BC Chicken Marketing Board (Chicken Board) with respect to Pricing Order 161 setting live price for Period A-170.

In its letter of June 28, 2021, BCFIRB requested the parties' positions with respect to deferring the appeal to the supervisory panel as part of the chicken pricing review process.

On June 29, 2021, the Chicken Board consented to the deferral of the appeal pursuant to section 8(8) of the Natural Products Marketing Act (NPMA). until after the completion of the Long Term Chicken Sector Pricing Review supervisory process. The Chicken Board noted that the deferral of the appeal cannot constrain the supervisory panel in terms of the issues that may be considered in the supervisory process, nor does it provide an opportunity for the PPPABC to seek particular relief before the supervisory panel as a person aggrieved or dissatisfied by a decision of the Chicken Board. If the appeal is deferred the consideration and determination of the issues raised in the notice of appeal are held in abeyance until following the conclusion of the supervisory process. Once the supervisory process has concluded, the appellant may at that time give notice that it wishes to pursue its appeal.

On July 2, 2021, the PPPABC also consented to the deferral of the appeal to the supervisory process underway noting that the supervisory panel has the authority to address the issues raised in the notices of appeal filed by PPPABC on May 7, 2021 and June 23, 2021 which raise significant concerns about the stability of current pricing structures in the BC chicken sector.

## DECISION

As I agree with he parties that the subject matter of this appeal is more properly dealt with by the supervisory panel as part of the chicken pricing review process, pursuant to s. 8(8) of the *NPMA*, I am deferring the hearing of this appeal until after the supervisory process is completed. It will be for the supervisory panel to determine how it will engage with the parties on the issues raised in this appeal.

Once the supervisory process is completed, the PPPABC can give notice of its intention to proceed with the appeal.
