This monthly report provides an overview of BC's forest product exports and markets. British Columbia export values are down -25% in March 2020 YTD compared to March 2019 YTD (\$2.4 billion vs \$3.2 billion).

- Lumber export Value is down -19% while volumes are down -22%. The decline is seen in lumber exports to China and Japan while lumber exports to the US remained flat.
- *Pulp and paper export* Pulp value is down -32% and the value of paper products is also down (-43%).
- Log and other wood exports The value of log exports is

down -72% while other wood products is up +3%. This increase is due to the higher other wood product export value to the US and UK.

- Share of Value (Table 4) Overall March YTD US share of export value is up from 41% to 53% between 2019 and 2020 while China's is down from 31% and Japan's is down from 10%.
- Value by destination United States (-4%), China (-37%), Japan (-40%) and other countries (-43%) are all down in March 2020 YTD.



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
#### **Export Values by Product and Destination**






Figure 16: Pulp Export Quantity
