B.C.'s Modernized Emergency Management Legislation: A New Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction, Response, and Recovery

B.C.'s modernized legislation will:

- Require risk assessments to consider how climate change may affect hazards
- Promote co-management
- Address all four phases of emergency management:
 - Mitigation
 - Preparation
 - Response
 - Recovery

Legislation: Critical Infrastructure

- Critical infrastructure owners will be required to prepare and maintain:
 - Risk assessments
 - Emergency management plans
 - Business continuity plans
- Critical infrastructure will be defined in regulations made under the new statute



Legislation: Local Authorities

- Risk assessments for foreseeable hazards within their jurisdictions
- At least one emergency management plan



Regulation: Local Authorities

- Clear requirements for risk assessments, emergency management plans, and business continuity plans
- A framework for multi-jurisdictional emergency management organizations
- Requirements to consult and cooperate with Indigenous governing bodies



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Regulation: Risk Assessments

Under the proposed legislation, risk assessments need to consider the:

- Degree of risk posed by a hazard
- Likelihood of the hazard leading to an emergency
- Potential scope and scale of an emergency
- Available Indigenous and local knowledge
- Potential impacts from climate change or extreme weather events
- Impacts on people, animals and places



Regulation: Emergency Management Plans

 Municipalities and regional districts will be required to have emergency management plans that are based on the results of risk assessments


