ORDER OF THE ADMINISTRATOR 2008-06

GAS COST ALLOWANCE RATE ORDER OF THE ADMINISTRATOR NET PROFIT ROYALTY REGULATION

Pursuant to subsection 2(i) of the Net Profit Royalty Regulation, I order as follows:

A gas cost allowance rate is calculated in accordance with the method outlined in this order:

1. Definitions:

"capital additions" or cap_a means the amount of eligible capital costs for a calendar year multiplied by 1.01;

"closing capital" or cape means the amount determined by the following formula:

$$cap_c = cap_o + cap_a - depreciation$$

"depreciation" means the amount for a calendar year determined by the following formula:

depreciation =
$$(cap_0 + cap_a) \times .05 \times (operating months/12)$$

"eligible capital cost" means an amount of capital costs for a calendar year that meet the eligibility criteria set out in section 3 of this Order and are considered capital in nature under GAAP;

"eligible operating cost" means an amount of operating costs for a calendar year that meet the eligibility criteria set out in section 3 of this Order and are considered operating in nature under GAAP;

"GAAP" means Canadian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles;

"land cost" is an amount equal to the purchase cost of the land and does not include land tenure payments;

"opening capital" or capo means for a calendar year that is

- (i) the first calendar year of operation, an amount equal to all capital additions incurred prior to the first calendar month of operation, or
- (ii) not the first calendar year of operation, an amount of eligible capital cost at January 1 of the calendar year and is equal to the amount of eligible capital costs incurred in calendar years preceding the calendar year reduced by depreciation for all previous years;

"operating months" means the number of full or partial months the producer-owned plant or producer-owned sales line operated in the calendar year;

"rate base" for a calendar year is equal to the amount determined by the following formula:

rate base = $(cap_0 + cap_0)/2 + land cost + (1.1 x eligible operating costs)/6$

"raw gas deliveries" is equal to the volume of raw gas delivered in 10³m³ to the producer-owned gathering system, producer-owned plant or producer-owned sales line for the calendar year.

"return on rate base" is an amount for a calendar year determined by the following formula:

return on rate base = 0.15 x rate base x (operating months/12)

2. Method for calculating a gas cost allowance rate:

A gas cost allowance rate must be determined in accordance with the following formula:

gas cost allowance rate = $\frac{1.1 \text{ x (eligible operating costs)} + \text{depreciation} + \text{return on rate base}}{\text{raw gas deliveries}}$

3. Eligible capital costs and operating costs:

To qualify as an eligible capital cost or eligible operating cost under this order, a cost must:

- be directly attributable to a producer-owned gathering system, producer-owned plant or producer-owned sales line;
- be incurred by the producer;
- be considered by the administrator to be reasonable in the circumstances;
- not have been recovered from another party; and
- not be specifically excluded pursuant to Schedules I and II of this order.

SCHEDULE I

GAS COST ALLOWANCE ORDER OF THE ADMINISTRATOR NET PROFIT ROYALTY REGULATION NON-ELIGIBLE CAPITAL COSTS

Capital costs incurred for the following items are not eligible for the purpose of determining a gas cost allowance rate.

- Any portion of a producer-owned gathering system, producer-owned plant or producerowned sales line located within the project ring fence of a net profit royalty project;
- Any portion of an all weather main access road located in Alberta;
- Interest costs:
- Producer-owned roads, other than an all weather main access road to a producer-owned plant;
- Vehicles, aircraft and mobile equipment;
- Wellhead equipment relating to the production of oil or gas;

SCHEDULE II

GAS COST ALLOWANCE ORDER OF THE ADMINISTRATOR NET PROFIT ROYALTY REGULATION NON-ELIGIBLE OPERATING COSTS

Operating costs incurred for the following items are not eligible for the purpose of determining a gas cost allowance rate.

- Goods & services tax
- · Income taxes;
- Interest costs:
- Loss of revenue insurance;
- Losses on disposal of capital;
- Oil and Gas Commission levy;
- Operating costs associated with non-eligible capital costs;
- Overhead and administrative costs;
- Petroleum and natural gas royalties;
- Production monitoring, controlling and communication costs;

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
