## **AMENDMENT NOTICE**

**To All Designated Inspection Facilities and Authorized Inspectors** 

### Re: Amendment for Inspection of Anti-Lock Brakes and Manual Slack Adjusters

As defined on notice 07-11 Amendment of Bulletin 03-10 Inspection of Air Brake Slack Adjusters and notice 08-11 Inspection of Anti-Lock Brakes vehicles must operate primarily on industrial and forestry service roads. Commercial Vehicle Safety & Enforcement (CVSE) has been advised of difficulties experienced by DIF and Al's in determining whether vehicles operate primarily on industrial and/or forest service roads in British Columbia.

To qualify for this exemption an individual or Carrier's vehicle(s) must operate a minimum of 55% by an overall cumulative total time or distance between inspection period intervals. On request of the DIF or Authorized Inspector, the driver must produce verifiable documentation that clearly supports 55% offroad usage, should the percentage of off-road use be in question. This may include:

- Driver log book
- Driver record or chart
- Off-Highway Refund Application FIN -141 under the Motor Fuel Tax Act

In addition, drivers and carriers that want to exercise this exemption must go to the Vehicle Inspections website <u>http://cvse.ca/vehicle\_inspections.htm</u> and print or download the Declaration of Exemption. The declaration must be sent to CVSE to certify the exemption with a distinctive mark and once completed will be sent back to applicant.

<u>Effective May 1, 2012</u>, on presentation of a completed Declaration of Exemption, Designated Inspection Facilities and Authorized Inspectors may pass the vehicle if certified with a distinctive mark by CVSE.

# On disclosure of a completed Declaration of Exemption vehicles may pass a provincial inspection if so equipped with properly functioning manual slack adjusters and / or non-functioning ABS component(s).

As part of the Commercial Vehicle Inspection, it is the responsibility of both the Designated Inspection Facility Operator and the Authorized Inspector (AI) to determine whether the vehicle meets all requirements set out on the Declaration of Exemption. See Appendix A and B below.

For application of this amendment, all other braking components must function properly and meet all applicable safety standards before passing.
