# Carbon Neutral Action Report Northwest Community College

## **Executive Summary**

Northwest Community College has ten campuses from Haida Gwaii to Houston and therefore faces a number of unique challenges in the reduction of greenhouse gases and achieving carbon neutrality. The college has implemented a number of initiatives and strategies to this end, and strives to be a catalyst in leading our communities in environmental best practices. Some initiatives currently underway are: conservation and fuel reducing strategies including implementation of video-conferencing, carpooling, regular fleet maintenance and procurement of energy efficient fleet vehicles. NWCC is expanding the recycling inventory to include such items as: all paper goods, cardboard, drink containers and electronic devices, and is actively engaged with community partners to initiate a composting project at the Terrace Campus. The College hosts an annual Community Green Fair, and annually, as resources allow, performs a number of energy conservation initiatives, for example: lighting retrofits DDC upgrades/boiler burner conversions, and building audits..

#### **Objectives**

In addition to the government's GHG reduction objectives, NWCC has these objectives: Promote a leadership role with other Public Sector organizations and municipal agencies, encourage greener practices and procedures college-wide, implement green initiatives cited in the green audits performed in summer of 2008, Focus on four key areas for improvement such as: Fleet driver training, Increase use of 30% recycled paper, promotion of anti-idling behavior, Implement nightly computer lab shutdowns.

## Part 2: Plans to Continue Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions 2009 -- 2011

#### Overview

Northwest Community College is committed to annual improvement toward the goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions and will focus on four main areas in the next 12 months: Fleet driver training to reduce fuel use, anti-idling implementation at all campuses, increasing the percentage of recycled paper (and reducing overall paper consumption), and initiating computer and monitor shut down nightly to preserve energy. These plans will enhance those already in progress (see above section).
