

Alyson Mary Banner (the “Respondent”)

Consent agreement signed: May 18, 2021

The Respondent was charged with acting improperly or breaching a term or condition of her licence on or about October 15, 2019 (the “Charge”).

On May 18, 2021, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”), pursuant to Rule 7.1 (c) of the Rules for Complaints, Investigations and Disciplinary Hearings, resolved the matter with the agreement of the Respondent by way of an alternative dispute resolution (the “Agreement”).

As part of the Agreement, the Respondent acknowledged and admitted that she acted incompetently and breached a term or condition of her licence in attending a call on or about October 15, 2019. Further, as part of the Agreement, the Respondent agreed to complete a course on cultural sensitivity and complete a research paper, which was to be submitted to the Board no later than 45 days after the Respondent or their representative was notified that the Board accepted the Agreement. The Agreement provided that if the research paper was not completed within 45 days the Respondent’s licence would be suspended until the completion of the requirement.

The Respondent failed to complete the required research paper within the 45-day timeline established in the Agreement. On August 14, 2021, the Board suspended the Respondent’s licence until the Agreement requirements are complete to the satisfaction of the Board.

On September 19, 2021, the Board determined that the Respondent had satisfactorily completed the Agreement requirements. The Respondent’s licence is no longer suspended.
