Re: Reinstatement of the temporary authority for BC liquor manufacturers to direct deliver liquor to retail customers from registered offsite storage locations.

Current Policy

Manufacturers may deliver liquor to retail customers from their onsite store only. They may not deliver to retail customers from their registered off-site storage locations.

From July 31, 2020 to October 31, 2020, BC liquor manufacturers were permitted to direct deliver liquor to retail customers from their registered offsite storage location(s). The temporary authority has expired.

New Policy

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Province's March 2020 declaration of a state of emergency and the Provincial Health Officer's March 2020 declaration of a public health emergency, the General Manager (GM) of the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch (LCRB) is putting in place time-limited measures to provide support to manufacturing licensees.

The GM is reinstating the authorization, by term and condition, to temporarily authorize manufacturers to direct deliver liquor to retail customers from their registered offsite storage locations.

This reinstated policy is effective up to and including **December 31, 2021**.

Explanation

The re-instatement of this time-limited policy responds to the emergency recommendation put forward by the Business and Technical Advisory Panel in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. It is intended to mitigate associated negative economic impacts on liquor

manufacturers.

The GM is satisfied that it is not contrary to the public interest to temporarily allow manufacturers to direct deliver their liquor products to customers from their registered offsite storage locations due to the extraordinary circumstances of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the state of emergency and the public health emergency.
