CORONER'S INQUEST INTO THE DEATH OF CHRISTOPHER PAUL KLIM

VERNON – The inquest into the death of Christopher Paul Klim has been scheduled. Mr. Klim was shot by Vernon RCMP during an incident at his residence on Dec. 27, 2007. He was taken to Vernon Jubilee Hospital where, despite medical treatment, he died.

The inquest is scheduled for Nov. 12-14, 2008. Presiding coroner Norm Leibel and a five-person jury will publicly hear evidence from subpoenaed witnesses in order to determine the facts surrounding the death. The jury will have the opportunity to make recommendations aimed at preventing deaths under similar circumstances in the future.
