Re: Change to BCVQA Stores

Introduction

New regulations have come into effect to amend the types of wine that may be sold in BCVQA stores.

Statutory Authority and Policy Rationale

Amendments to regulation 14.1 and to policy have been made to permit BCVQA stores to sell 100% BC wine even if not BCVQA certified. This is subject to approval by the BC Wine Institute who holds the licences for these stores. This change is to align the types of wines that may be sold in BCVQA stores with that permitted under the special wine store licence to be issued later this year by way of an auction process. BC wine includes cider, mead and sake made from 100% BC agricultural inputs.
