The Location

The City of [Dawson Creek](#), or the Mile Zero City, is the starting point on the famous Alaska Highway, and is the largest centre in the Peace River South region. Dawson Creek has a population of about 12,000 and celebrated its 60th anniversary in 2018.

The Community

A modern airport connects Dawson Creek to the rest of the world. Central Mountain Air has 52 flights a week, including non-stop service into Vancouver. Communities near Dawson Creek include Fort St John, Hudson's Hope and Taylor.

Northern Lights College has a Dawson Creek campus and is home to the Aircraft Maintenance Engineering program, which is part of the Trades and Apprenticeship Division. The Dawson Creek Campus includes Aboriginal Education and Student Recruitment services, on-site student residence, library, gymnasium, daycare facility, and access to city transit.

What's special about Dawson Creek?

Visit the Alaska Highway House, take a historic walking tour to learn about the city's interesting past, visit a pioneer village or enjoy a visit to the waterfowl refuge at McQueen's Slough. The city is situated at the union between the Boreal Forests and the Taiga Plains; explore pristine woodlands, steep valleys, and a variety of rivers.
