What are essential oils from tree species?

Essential Oils are steam-distilled from fresh, sustainably harvested conifer needles gathered in the forests of British Columbia. Several commercial species are being utilized—Lodgepole (Shore) pine (*Pinus contorta*), Sitka spruce (*Picea sitchensis*), Douglas-fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*), Western Hemlock (*Tsuga heterophylla*), and others.
