1. PURPOSE OF THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

The Parties' legal obligations are set out in the Final Agreement. The purpose of the Implementation Plan (the Plan) is to create a written record that:

- reflects the Parties' common understanding at Effective Date about the "who", "when", and "what" of implementation activities that have been jointly identified as necessary to fulfilling their respective and shared obligations;
- provides a level of detail to support the Parties, and their staff and agents, in establishing stable and predictable, yet flexible, relationships;
- assists the Parties and their staff and agents, in the effective and efficient implementation of the Final Agreement; and
- helps to avoid delays, misunderstandings and litigation regarding fulfilment of legal obligations.

2. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The Parties acknowledge that, in accordance with Chapter 24 "Implementation" of the Final Agreement, the Plan:

- does not create legal obligations;
- does not alter any rights or obligations described in the Final Agreement;
- does not preclude any Party from asserting that rights or obligations exist under the Final Agreement even though they are not referred to in the Plan;
- is not to be used to interpret the Final Agreement;
- is for a period of ten years from the Effective Date of the Final Agreement; and
- may be revised, renewed or extended by the Parties upon recommendation by the Implementation Committee.

3. GENERAL

To the extent the Plan uses words and phrases that are defined in the Final Agreement, the words and phrases in the Plan have the same meaning as in the Final Agreement.


Any review of the Plan by the Implementation Committee is distinct from Periodic Review under Chapter 2 "General Provisions".
