

## Indigenous Climate Leadership




Commitment from Tk'emlúpsemc

Core funding for local government and regional networks is critical to provide long-term support and capacity to staff across BC.





#### Peer Networks



#### Implementation cohorts:

 Focusing on implementing a specific priority identified by the Peer Networks e.g. EV readiness policy

#### Working groups

• Lead research, best practices, etc. to share with topical networks

#### Geographically focused:

- Thompson-Okanagan
- Vancouver Island Coastal Communities
- Northern BC (including Health, Industry + Institutions)

#### Sub-groups to focus on local priorities

 Building sector capacity, public EV charging, adaptation and resilience


