Briefly describe the top three actions taken by your organization in 2018 to reduce GHG emissions and/or improve sustainability from its operations:

Action

- 1. Procurement at ITA continued to enhance its social responsible practices by engaging new and existing suppliers throughout the country in dialogue via a variety of creative procurement projects that led or will soon lead to sustainable contracts. In 2018/2019, ITA started 11 competitive procurements some of them continuing into the next fiscal year and engaged more than 79 organizations. ITA is represented at the Provincial Crowns Senior Procurement group and participates into various provincial collaborations and is a voting member of the Canadian Public Procurement Commission. In 2018 ITA became an active member of the Canadian Aboriginal Council and used its status to set base for a unique procurement model that engaged multiple Indigenous communities into discussions and will lead to sustainable contracts with Indigenous entities across British Columbia.
- 2. ITA continues to implement VM machines in its offices to enhance the employees' ability to work remotely and minimize carbon foot print. This is an ongoing process. ITA continues to set access to Skype for business on all desktops to reduce the amount of travel to and from meetings between ITA and outside parties. ITA is also hosting many webinars in lieu of in person meetings to reduce the amount of travel required by participants.
- 3. In 2015, ITA started to develop a CRM system to enhance communication and build electronic data base. This continued in 2017 and it is an ongoing process.
