The Family Justice Registry requirements apply when family law cases are filed in the Kelowna, Nanaimo or Vancouver (Robson Square) Registry of the Provincial Court of BC.

The requirements apply to cases about:

- parenting arrangements
- child support
- contact with a child
- guardianship of a child
- spousal support
