From the date when the SOW is registered in MTO, an assessment report in support of that work must be submitted within:

Technical Work: 90 days

Physical Work: 30 days

## **Event Registration**

### Statement of Work (SOW)

On or before the expiry date of a claim, the title holder, or their agent, must register a summary of the work done on a claim in Mineral Titles Online (MTO). This will keep the claim in good standing for one or more years (up to 10 years from the current anniversary year). Registered work can be technical, physical, or a combination of both.

## **Report Submission**

Include a copy of the SOW registration with your report. If more than one SOW has been registered for the same work program, include copies of all these related events with your report.

If you register an additional SOW after a report has already been submitted (within one year of the completion date of the work) for which you have previously submitted a report, you must inform the Mineral Titles office by email. Please provide the original SOW event number and new SOW event number that is to be covered by the original report.

Submit **only one copy** of your typed report by one of the following methods:

Physical Reports must include, but not limited to:

- **1. Dimensions of work**For example, trenches or pits (in metric units)
- 2. GPS Coordinates for all site locations
- 3. Amount of material removed In metric units
- 4. Actual dates work was performed on claim(s)
- 5. Qualifications/experience of operators
- 6. Map at the scale of 1:10 000 or better, showing where work was performed

8. Itemized Cost Statement

All costs must be itemized with an item description and how the item was calculated
