


What is this permit for?	A Permit to Accompany allows a resident hunter to accompany up to two non-resident or non-resident alien persons while hunting big game in British Columbia.
	NOTE: Any non-resident or non-resident alien who is listed on a Permit to Accompany application must have an active Fish and Wildlife ID (FWID) with verified user status and the appropriate residency credential before they can be added to the application. For more information, go to www.gov.bc.ca/hunting .
Who can apply for this permit?	Resident hunters 19 years of age and older, who meet the qualifications to apply. For more information, go to www.gov.bc.ca/hunting .





Before you start

Before applying for a Permit to Accompany (PTA), you will need:

- A Fish and Wildlife ID with verified user status
- Active BC resident and hunting credentials
- No active Hunting suspensions or outstanding royalties or reports
- A basic BCeID to sign on to the BC Hunting Online service
- Credit card for payment (Fee: \$55.00)


NOTE: A BCeID is an account that provides secure electronic access to online government services, including the BC Hunting online system. If you do not have a BCeID, you will be prompted to register for one when you sign on at www.gov.bc.ca/hunting.

Getting Started

 Click on the Apply for Permit to Accompany link under Application Options on your Fish and Wildlife profile.






Step 1 – Select Licence Year

The Application for Permit to Accompany page is displayed.

- Select the Licence Year radio button for the licence year in which you plan to hunt with the Permit to Accompany.
- Click the Add Person button, a pop-up box will be displayed.



Step 2 – Add Person(s) to be Accompanied

- Enter the FWID, Last Name and First Initial of the first Person to be Accompanied.
- Click Save & Close. The system will look for the Fish and Wildlife profile of the Person to be Accompanied.
- If the profile is found, the person's name will appear in a table.
- If the profile is not found, the person to be accompanied will need to register for a FWID, create a profile and apply for their credentials before they can be added to a Permit to Accompany application.

NOTE: Any non-resident or non-resident alien who will be listed on a Permit to Accompany application must have an active Fish and Wildlife profile with verified user status and the appropriate residency credential before they can be added to the application. 




Relationship to Applicant

NOTE: If the person to be accompanied is a non-resident alien, you must provide the family relationship you have to the non-resident alien.

- If the person to be accompanied is a non-resident alien, click on the Relationship to Applicant dropdown list next to the name of the Person To Be Accompanied.
- Select the appropriate relationship.
- If there is a second person to be accompanied, you can click the Add Person button to include a second person on the PTA, or you can go to Step 3.



Step 3 – Hunt Details

Hunt Duration

- Enter a Start Date (mmm dd, yyyy)
- Enter an End Date (mmm dd, yyyy)

NOTE: The hunt duration must not exceed 21 days, including the first and last day of the hunt.

Hunt Region

 Click on the dropdown arrow in the Region field and select the region you wish to hunt in.

Requested Management Units (MUs)/Species

- Click the Add MU/Species button a row will be displayed to select the MU.
 - Select a MU from the dropdown list
- Click on the Add Species button.
 - Select the species you wish to add to your application.
- You can add additional MUs and species by clicking on the Add MU/Species button.

NOTE: A PTA is not a licence to hunt. PTA holders and the persons they accompany must also have valid hunting and species licences.



Step 4 – Add to Shopping Cart

- Click the attestation box to confirm that you meet the requirements to hold a Permit to Accompany.
- Click **Add to Shopping Cart** to proceed to payment.
- If you click **CANCEL**, your application will not be saved.

Step 5 - Pay and Finish

- Review your purchase(s) in your shopping cart
- Click the attestation checkbox to confirm that your products are correct.
- Click Continue Shopping to purchase additional products.
- Click Complete Checkout to purchase products.
- Complete the payment process.
- After payment is completed, you can view or print your receipt or return to your profile details.



Step 6 - View application history

- From your Fish and Wildlife profile, click on **Applications** under **Application Options** to view details and status of your application.
 - In Review application is in review
 - **Application Incomplete** click on the application ID to determine what information you must provide. You can also withdraw your application at this time.
 - New the PTA application has been created but not submitted as it is not yet paid for.
 - Approved the PTA application has been approved. Your PTA permit will appear under **Permit Options.**
 - **Denied** the PTA application has been denied.
 - Withdrawn by Applicant this indicates that you withdrew your application.
