Action

- 1. The BC Games Society continues to educate and encourage each host community to have the lowest carbon footprint possible in the community. Each BC Games host society has an Environment Chair that not only oversees that each Games has an environmental plan, but also encourages the parties involved to minimize the impact of the Games on the community. This Chair encourages the Board, volunteers, participant, and the overall community to reduce the environmental impact of the Games on the community. These guidelines are updated after each Games.
- 2. Team BC became part of BC Games Society in 2013; however, the first Canada Games that BC Games was part of were the 2015 Canada Winter Games with 348 Team BC participants and the 2015 Western Canada Summer Games with 427 Team BC participants. Team BC follows the BC Games Society standards and provides guidelines for their volunteers in electronic format. Most of the communication is also done electronically. Volunteers meet regularly; however, most of the meetings are over the phone, further reducing the carbon footprint.
- 3. In 2015, the BC Games Society used the least amount of paper since reporting started in 2010. This reflects our commitment to reducing our carbon footprint. The BC Games staff creates more material for volunteers in electronic format and utilizes document sharing software.

Describe plans your organization has for continuing to minimize your GHG emissions:

BC Games will continue to utilize bio-diesel buses for transportation of the participants to and from the host communities. When in the community, BC Games Society staff ensures that participants are accommodated as close to their sport venue as possible, further reducing the Games carbon footprint. BC Games will continue to provide most of the guidelines for the host communities in electronic format. File sharing software will also continue being utilized as much as possible. Moreover, the BC Games office will continue to recycle and compost and use reCYCLISTS – a pollution free company that utilizes human power for compost pick up.


