Interim Measures Agreement

Between: Esketemc First Nation

As represented by Chief and Council Esketemc First Nation

28/1/05 - Die Yourd Inspersion Some Dries de Jans. 1/06

And

Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province of British Columbia As represented by the Minister of Forests (the "Government of British Columbia")

(collectively the "Parties")

Whereas:

- The Esketemc First Nation signed a Forest and Range Agreement with the Government of British Columbia on March 26, 2004.
- A commitment was made in December 2003 that on completion of the timber reallocation provided for under the Forestry Revitalization Act, an economic opportunity would be made available to Esketemo First Nation in the Williams Lake Timber Supply Area.
- The Government of British Columbia wishes to support additional economic opportunities for the Esketemo First Nation.

Therefore the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Upon execution of this Interim Measures Agreement by the Parties, the Minister will invite the Esketemc First Nation to apply for a non-replaceable forest licence under section 47.3 of the Forest Act to harvest a total of up to 107,000 cubic meters over a five year term in the Williams Lake Timber Supply Area.
- 2. The invitation to apply and any licence(s) entered into as a result of the invitation to apply under this agreement will be subject to the policies, regulations and statutes of British Columbia as amended from time to time.
- 3. Any licence entered into as a result of the invitation to apply under this agreement will:
 - be for a term of no longer than 5 years as determined by the Minister.
 - not be transferable or divisible without the consent of the Minister.
 - not be replaceable as defined in the Forest Act,
 - not allow for an extension to the term of the ilcence.

- contain other terms and conditions required by law, including the condition that the Esketemc First Nation must comply with the Esketemc First Nation Forest and Range Agreement (March 2004) and,
- include other terms and conditions related to administration of the licence as may be required by the Regional Manager.
- 4. The Parties will agree to the operating area prior to making application for the non-replaceable forest licence. The operating area will be in the Williams Lake Timber Supply Area.
