This August 2nd is B.C. Day in the province of British Columbia. The holiday was introduced by the Legislative Assembly in 1974, with the aim of creating a statutory holiday to recognize the pioneers of the province. Today it is celebrated with camping, festivals, BBQs and time spent relaxing with family and friends.

There are a number of official symbols of British Columbia. These include the Steller's Jay, Pacific Dogwood, jade and Western Red Cedar. The DCV has numerous products featuring these emblems.

For a memorable gift that will last a lifetime, the DCV carries Red Cedar and Pacific Dogwood seeds. Pacific Dogwood is actually protected by law and cannot be picked, removed or destroyed. Red Cedar items include a cribbage board, wall plaque, boxes with pewter designs and smoked salmon in a red cedar box.

Recipe: Grilled Chicken with Beer and Maple Syrup

Ingredients:

- * 12 oz. beer
- * 1/3 cup maple syrup
- * 1/2 cup tropical fruit juice
- * 1 tbsp. soya sauce
- * 1 tbsp. Dijon mustard
- * 1 green onion, thinly sliced
- * 1/2 tsp. chopped garlic
- * 1/2 tsp. savory
- * 2 1/2 lb. chicken, cut into pieces
- * salt and pepper to taste

Preparation:

In a large pan, boil the beer by half, and cool. In a large bowl, stir together the beer, maple syrup, tropical fruit juice, soya sauce, mustard, green onion, garlic and savory. Add the chicken pieces, turn to coat on all sides and marinate in the refrigerator for at least 4 hours.

Drain the chicken pieces well, season and grill on the barbecue for 20 - 25 minutes over medium hot coals. Brush the chicken pieces with the remaining marinade during the grilling. Serve with vegetable shish kebabs and a green salad.

Did You Know?

- * Maple syrup is highly concentrated maple sap. Thirty-six to 44 litres of evaporated maple sap is needed to make one litre of maple syrup.
- * Maple season is during March and April and lasts from 3-6 weeks.
- * The most syrup a tree can produce in the whole season is one litre.
- * You can use maple syrup anytime to flavour milk, cold cereals, oatmeal, yogurt, milkshakes, eggnogs, ice cream, coffee, tea, fruit (especially grapefruit), carrots, sweet potatoes, baked apples, baked beans... anywhere you use sugar.
