Decoding Drought event held in Courtenay- and two more coming to the region!

On March 5th, 60 producers attended a Decoding Drought Management Engagement Session in Courtenay. These drought engagement events have been delivered around BC, particularly in areas impacted by drought and water curtailments under the Water Sustainability Act, as happened this summer in the Tsolum watershed.

Similar upcoming events include a virtual session on April 4th for the West Coast region, and a

follow-up session for the Cowichan area April 18th, to build on the previous engagement with producers in the Koksilah watershed. Workshops are co-delivered by staff from the ministries of Agriculture and Food, and Water, Land and Resource Stewardship (WLRS). Recordings of the presentations are now available here. Islands Agriculture Show

The 2024 Islands Agriculture Show conference took place February 2 and 3, 2024, at the Cowichan Exhibition Park in Duncan. This two-day conference was geared towards horticultural and livestock producers of all sizes on Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands. Held in conjunction with an agricultural trade show and delivered in partnership with the Islands Agriculture Show Society (IASS), the conference featured 14 sessions on topics including crop production, livestock production, business planning, water management, and climate adaptation. This year, over 200 people attended the conference sessions and there were 1600 visits to the event!

Session highlights included Building Healthy Soils, Planting Hedgerows for Pollinators and Pest Management, Climate Adapted Farming and On-Farm Meat Processing. The keynote address by Jared (Qwustenuxun) Williams was standing room only- the talk was titled Indigenous Agriculture: Creating Food Systems that are Indistinguishable from Nature.




Regional Extension Update
