British Columbia export values are down -6% for March 2019 year to date (YTD) compared to the same period in 2018 (**\$3.2** billion vs **\$3.4** billion)

- Lumber value YTD is down -11% while volumes are down -4%. The value of Other Wood Products is down -11% while log exports YTD are down (-9%)
- *Pulp export* value is up +1% and so is the value of paper products (+7%).
- Value by destination United States (-13%) and Japan are down (-12%), China (+3%) and other countries (+2%) has increased.



- **YTD exports to China (Table 4)** Softwood lumber value increased by **+28%** y/y resulting in China making up **21%** of softwood lumber values YTD. It's share of softwood lumber export values in March 2018 YTD was 15%.
- Share of log value (Table 4) Japan's share of March 2019 YTD (32%) is now closer to China's share (47%) compared to March 2018 YTD with Japan at 27% and China at 48% of log export value.
- *Pulp exports to the United States (Table 9)* Compared to 2018, March YTD in 2019 is up +61% for pulp exports to the US.



Export Values by Product and Destination



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

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




Figure 8: Other Wood Export Value -

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


Figure 13: Exchange Rate US\$/C\$




Figure 17: Pulp Export Quantity
