The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to recommend pursuant to Section 14 (5) of the "Mineral Act" and Section 16 (1) of the "Placer-mining Act", chapters 213 and 214 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, respectively, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following areas in the Nanaimo and Alberni Mining Divisions, namely:

An area 400 feet wide, being 200 feet on either side of Pipeline Scheme No. I and Pipeline Scheme No. II, from a point on Heber River to Crest Lake; and between Crest Lake and Upper Drum Lake; and between Upper Drum Lake and Drum Lakes, all as shown on Plan No. 1; and

All ground in the Salmon River Valley and its tributaries below the 740-foot contour, upstream from the intersection of the south boundary of Lot 147, Block A, and its western extension with the said contour; and an area 400 feet wide, being 200 feet on either side of a proposed canal between the Salmon River and Brewster Lake; and all ground below the 606-foot contour surrounding Brewster Lake; and all ground below the 601-foot contour surrounding Gray Lake; and all ground below the 592-foot contour surrounding Whymper Lake; and all ground that may be flooded between Brewster Lake and Upper Campbell Lake, all as shown on Plan No. 2; and

All land below the 1210-foot contour surrounding Upper Quinsam Lake from where a northwest-southeast line intersects the said contour one-half mile below the outlet of Upper Quinsam Lake; and an area 400 feet wide, being 200 feet on each side of a proposed canal between Quinsam River and Gooseneck Lake, all as shown on Plan No. 3.

And further to recommend that the reserves established by this Order in Council be cancelled, subject to the following provisions and that a notice to this effect be signed by the Minister and published in the Gazette:

No holder of a mineral claim, or placer-mining claim or lease that may hereafter be located within the area formerly covered by the reserves shall interfere or allow any person exploring, developing, mining or working in any way the said claim or lease to interfere in any manner with the construction, operation and maintenance of any works, pipelines, canals, dams, or ways constructed by or for the British Columbia Power Commission; and



No holder of a mineral claim, or placer-mining claim or lease, or any person shall carry on any exploration, development, or mining operation of any kind whatsoever within 250 feet of any works, pipelines, canals, dams, or ways constructed by or for the British Columbia Power Commission, unless the permission of the Chief Inspector of Mines has first been obtained; and

No holder of a mineral claim, or placer-mining claim or lease, or any person exploring, developing, mining or working in any way the said mineral claim or placer-mining claim or lease shall be entitled to any claim for damages that may be caused by the construction, operation and maintenance of any works, pipelines, canals, dams, or ways constructed by or for the British Columbia Pewer Commission to any workings or structures which may come into existence on the said mineral claim or placer-mining claim or lease within the reserved areas herein cancelled.


