PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY AND REPORTING PROJECT – DRAFT MEASURES FOR REVIEW AND DISCUSSION

Further to my letters of March 12, 2018¹ and April 17, 2018², please find attached the draft measures for governance and quota management and movement, along with a framework for the development of industry performance targets.

Good governance and informed, strategic decision making are essential elements for commodity boards and BCFIRB, in order to deliver sound marketing policy. In relation, BCFIRB's recent February 2, 2018 supervisory decision – Quota Assessment Tools Supervisory Review – requires supply-managed boards to collect and report objective quota management and movement data to evaluate and demonstrate rules and policies continue to fulfill sound marketing policy.
