^{**} Multiculturalism grants were a one-time grant available in government fiscal year 2012/13 offered and funded by the Ministry of Finance and Minister Responsible for Multiculturalism. These grants are not considered gaming grants, but are shown in this report because they were administered by the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch.

^{*} Unused grant funds returned were \$63,757 (funds paid to community organizations in the previous year which did not get used and which were returned this year). Grant funds must be returned if an organization has not used its grant funding within 12 months of receiving it, or if the organization ceases operation.

^{**} Gaming event licence reported earnings as of July 14, 2017, including losses. It is estimated that total licensed gaming earnings in 2016/17 were approximately \$39.9 million.
