This report provides an overview of British Columbia's forest product exports and markets. In 2022, forest product exports made up 24% of B.C.'s total commodity export value.

Starting with the March report in 2023, Macau is included in the exports to China. The historical export data from 2013 to 2022 has also been updated.








Figure 9: Logs Export Value \$0.07 \$0.6 \$0.06 Monthly Value (lines), \$ billions \$0.5 \$0.05 \$0.4 \$0.04 \$0.3 \$0.03 \$0.02 \$0.1 \$0.01 \$0.00 \$0.0 2022 YTD 2023 YTD -- 2022 Monthly ••••• 2023 Monthly
