## Addendum to Application – Electronic Raffle Systems

## **BEFORE YOU START**

Eligible organizations are permitted to use Electronic Raffle Systems (ERS) to conduct Class A and Class B Ticket Raffles. This form must be submitted in support of a ticket raffle application to provide information about your planned use of ERS. The Gaming Policy Enforcement Branch (GPEB) will use the information provided to assess applicant eligibility for use of an ERS.

## It is recommended the following is reviewed prior to submission:

Section 12 – ERS, of the <u>Licensed Charitable Gaming Rules (the Rules)</u> and all other licensing requirements, including those outlined in the Rules, relevant conditions, policies, procedures and orders issued by GPEB.

As per section 10 of the Rules, the following Technology Facilitated Gaming Events (Non-ERS) components do not require a completed addendum form:

Live Streaming, Electronic Fund Transfers, Sales via the Internet, Online Ordering and Scanning and Emailing of Entries.

These components do not require Registration or Certification and are permitted on all classes of licences, however, may be limited by event type.

Permitted Electronic Raffle Systems:	System Description
Online Ticket Sales	To sell tickets through the Internet by way of a real time processing and payment system where the purchaser's ticket is paid for and delivered immediately online.
Online Ticket Distribution	To send a purchaser a ticket by email or through the internet and where the purchaser downloads a copy of the ticket.
Electronic Ticket Draw	To determine a prize winner by conducting an electronic draw using computer software or a computer application that utilizes a GPEB-certified software random number generator (RNG).
Online Prize Distribution	To send a winner a prize voucher by email or online and where the prize winner downloads a voucher or gift certificate for redemption in cases where the prizes are suitable for online distribution and each prize is worth \$2,500 or less.
Raffle Sales Unit (RSU)	A GPEB approved unit for ticket sales which is comprised of a combination of hardware and/or software provided by a registered gaming services provider and which is configured to operate as a point of sale that generates and prints or delivers raffle tickets.
