ON THE APPLICATION of His Majesty the King in right of the Province of British Columbia and the BC Transportation Financing Authority (the "Province") without notice coming on for hearing at Vancouver on May 11, 2023 on hearing Michael Kleisinger, counsel for the Province;

## THIS COURT ORDERS that:

- 1. This Order applies to all the plaintiffs' lands and structures inside the outlined unshaded area designated in Schedule 'A', including:
  - Mountain Highway road interchange, its on and off ramps, medians, pedestrian areas, and the overpass (the "Overpass"); and
  - b. the area within 250 meters of the Overpass in either direction along the Trans-Canada Highway.

(collectively, the "Designated Area")

- 2. Within the Designated Area, no person with knowledge of this order will:
  - a. affix anything to, or hang or display anything from, or over any structure including the Overpass;
  - b. congregate, gather, occupy or use the area; and
  - c. intentionally obstruct, impede, disrupt, interfere with, or distract vehicle or pedestrian traffic (the "travelling public").
- 3. This Order does not apply to the normal, transient, and lawful passing of the travelling public through the Designated Area;
- 4. No person with knowledge of this order will intimidate, disrupt, or interfere with the Province's staff, employees, agents, or contractors in the discharge of their respective duties and functions with respect to this Order or in the Designated Area.
- All employees, servants, agents or contractors of the Province may remove any structures or things constructed, erected, affixed, maintained, placed in the Designated Area contrary to this Order.
- The Royal Canadian Mounted Police or any other policing authority (collectively the "Police"), may arrest and remove any person who has knowledge of this Order and who the Police have reasonable and probably grounds to believe is contravening or has contravened any provision of this Order.
- The Police retain discretion as to the timing and manner of enforcement of this Order, and specifically retain discretion as to the timing and manner of arrest and removal of any person pursuant to this Order.
- The Defendants, or any interested party, may apply to this Court to set aside or vary this Order after providing counsel for the Province 48 hours notice in advance of their application.

- 9. The Province may serve this order:
  - a. by posting copies of the Order in prominent locations within the Designated Area;
  - b. by posting a copy of the order on the Province's public website; and
  - c. in accordance with the Rules.
