Re: Public Education Funding Model Review

The Gold Trail Board of Education has discussed the Funding Model review at their recent Open Board meetings. The Gold Trail district is located in the interior of BC and provides educational services to several municipalities and Indigenous communities in the region. With a student population of 1,110 FTE, with 62% of students being of Indigenous ancestry, the district's rural schools are an important part of the communities they serve.

The Board identified several factors for consideration during the funding model review process:

- Board autonomy and flexibility in the allocation of funds needs to be respected. The current Unique Geographic Factor (UGF) needs to be maintained in order to recognize the many differences between districts throughout the province. The UGF provides a measure of equity for all districts.
- Adequate transportation funding is essential to ensure students have access to educational opportunities, including after school programs and extra-curricular activities.
- The social emotional needs of students are increasing and require the additional allocation of funds to ensure a supportive learning environment for all students.
- Connectivity and access to technology are important in order to provide a quality educational experience. The costs are high in this area and increasing.
- The new funding model must be mindful and recognize our collective responsibility to provide a quality, equitable education system for Indigenous students.
- Capital funds must be allocated throughout the province and the necessity of boards using
 operating dollars to support capital projects should be minimized. An appropriate learning
 environment is essential and influences positive student outcomes yet many projects are being
 completed using operating dollars.
